Before you begin, evaluate your site and involve key stakeholders. Site Assessment: - Existing shade, trees, and natural features - Drainage and soil quality - Sun exposure and wind direction - Nearby classrooms, pathways, or hazards Stakeholder Input: - Ask children about preferred play types - Get feedback from teachers on supervision needs - Include grounds staff for maintenance concerns - Discuss long-term goals with administration Tip: Use a site map or aerial photo to mark out zones and constraints.

Key Elements: - Movement: Timber balance beams, stepping logs, climbing mounds - Sensory: Herb gardens, water channels, bark chips, texture paths - Quiet Space: Wooden cubby house, shaded reading area - Social Play: Sand pit with borders, mud kitchen, plant tunnel - Inclusive Access: Wide paths, varying heights, open-ended items Zoning Tip: Group loud and active zones separately from quiet areas.

Stage 1 (Term 1): Site prep & natural landscape - Mulch, log edging, drainage, tree planting Stage 2 (Term 2): Core play elements - Install timber climbers, balance logs, recycled plastic slide tower Stage 3 (Term 3): Enhancements - Add mud kitchen, sensory garden, shade cloths, loose parts storage This model helps you spread costs while achieving early impact.
